IMPORTANT NOTICE Ragging is an offence

Ragging in any form is cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the College / Institution / University.

Extract of Tamilnadu Govt.Gazette - Dated 29.01.97 (Bill No. 8 of 1997 Tamilnadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

- 1. "Ragging" Means display of noisy, disorderly Conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes.
- a. Teasing, abusing of playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student; or
- b. Asking the students to do any act or perform something, which such students will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
- 2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
- 3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits participates, in abets or propagates "Ragging" within or out side any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for the term which may extended to two years and shall also be liable to fine which may be extended to ten thousand rupees.

- 4. Any students convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such students shall not be admitted in any other educational institutions.
- 5. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, when ever any student complaints of ragging to the head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, (such head of the educational institution or person responsible for the management if the educational institution) shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence from the educational institution.

Ragging is totally prohibited in the college, hostel and outside the campus. Ragging is not a fun but an inhuman act. Those found responsible for ragging will be very severely punished. Even among minor violation had been very seriously dealt with resulting in dismissal from the college.Ragging is totally absent in our institution. Thank you students for the continued support extended.

General Rules and Regulations for students

1. Students shall attend the college neatly and decently dressed. Girl students should wear salwar kameez with thuppata. Girl students have to wear light blue overcoats reaching down to their knees and cut shoes. Boy students should wear pants, shirts and shoes. All students should attend the workshop practical, fieldwork etc., with uniform with proper Shoes. Uniform for boys is dark blue pant and light blue half shirt with tuck in. Black shoes made of leather have to be worn.

- 2. Gathering in groups at the entrance, exit, pathways, play fields, gardens and gates is strictly forbidden. On entering the classroom, all should observe strict silence. No students should enter or leave the classroom without the permission of the faculty.
- 3. Students shall not be permitted without identity card, proper laboratory Uniform and shoes to attend the class, laboratory and CIA test.
- 4. Students are not allowed to leave the campus during working hours except the lunch time. Leave applications must be sent to the HOD forwarded by the Student counsellor with the signature of the parent. Incase of sickness, leave applications must be sent to the Principal through HOD along with a medical certificate.
- 5. Cigarette smoking, liquor consumption and use of drug, pan parag and chewing-gum inside the college campus are strictly prohibited.
- 6. Rude behavior, violent attitude, ragging and teasing fellow students would attract disciplinary action under the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act No. 7 of 1997. Meeting of any kind held in and outside the college premises without the permission of the principal is strictly banned. Collecting money from fellow students for any purpose is not allowed.
- 7. No notice or information or report is to be sent to the press or broadcasting agencies without

- 8. the approval of the principal. Students are prohibited to enter office room and staff room during unspecified hours.
- 9. Damaging the building, furniture, transport vehicles and laboratory equipments in any way by any student calls for very strict disciplinary action. The cost of damage so caused will be recovered from the respective students. If the responsibility for the damage cannot be fixed on any individual the cost of damage will be collected from the students collectively.
- 10. Students should read the college notice board everyday. Ignorance of any information

displayed in the Notice board will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with the directions contained in it.

- 11. Bicycles and other vehicles must be parked safely at the appropriate places. Vehicles found in the unauthorized places will be impounded and released only on payment of fines. No students are allowed to drive any vehicles inside the campus.
- 12. All fees must be paid on the dates notified in the college notice board. If the fees are not paid with in the stipulated time, the defaulters name shall be struck off from the rolls.

13. Identity cards will be issued to all students soon after admission. Students are required to wear their identity cards as a rule. The identity cards are an absolute

requirement to appear for examinations, scholarship, visit library etc.

- 14. The prescribed minimum attendance for a student is 75% for each paper in a semester. If the student fails to comply with, she/ he shall not be permitted to appear for University examinations.
- 15. All certificates will be issued after submission of a request letter to the college office. In general two days notice is necessary for the certificates. Certificates will be issued to the students only on production of their identity cards.
- 16. Representation of complaints and reasonable grievances may be made to the principal through the respective Head of the Department.
- 17. The decision of the principal shall be final in all matters of disciplinary action pertaining to the rules and regulations of the college.

- 4. Offer services, advice to undertake engineering assignments only in the areas of his competence and to furnish correct information of his qualifications and experience to concerned client.
- 5. Uphold and maintain confidentiality and respect for secrets confided in him by the clients, employers and employees in connection with any professional work undertaken by him.
- 6. Keep informed and updated in his area of professional activity and strive to provide opportunities for professional development of his subordinates.

- 7. Conduct without consideration of caste, creed, and social status and shall not perform and act against the interest of the nation.
- 8. Present clearly to all concerned the possible consequences of ignoring, overruling or discarding technological and engineering decisions or judgments without proper justification.
- 9. Not directly or indirectly injure the professional reputation of another engineer.
- 10. Not to accept any unauthorized commission, discount, allowance or profit direct or indirect to himself in connection with any work under his charge or for any professional business entrusted to him.
- 11. Not to act in a manner, this may injure the reputation or the image of the institution or may cause damage to the institution financially or otherwise.

Library Facilities

UG Library, the learning support, provides 41109 volumes of text and reference books with 60 National and 686 International Journals. Online Journal access through Institutional membership in DELNET, ICTACT, SPRINGER and NDL has been provided for staff and students. The Library is located in a two storied building with 662 sqm build up area along with airconditioned discussion rooms. The Library is fully computerized with bar code system.

PG Library provides 19625 volumes of text and reference books with 12 National and 287 International Journals. The PG Library located in 262 sqm. build up area. The Library is fully computerized with bar code system.

Computing Facilities:

The college is well equipped with Intel Pentium based Windows 2000, 2003 servers, Rack servers, Linux servers, with necessary software support. There are more than 775 nodes with powerful servers with the capacity for designing, drafting, analysis and multimedia application. All the students and faculty can access these resources at anytime of the day.

Internet Access Facility:

300 MBPS Broad Band internet access facility has been provided to the students. In addition, a campus intranet facility comprising of 100/1000 MBPS Intranet web services, mail services, file sharing, printing and database services. This service is available for 24 hours a day. The college campus is enabled with 54 MBPS Wi-Fi facility.

Language Lab

A state-of-the-art Language Laboratory with 40 conventional Audio Interactive Systems and 15 Multimedia Educational Network Systems has been established to enable learners to develop aural and oral fluency. The language laboratory with its high tech equipment and acoustically treated roof and walls provide an excellent environment for the learners. The ergonomic design of the cubicles and its interior sets the right ambience for hours of hectic practice. The hardware is supplemented with latest language software to train the students in U.K. English, U.S. English, Linguaphone Business English. Adequate software's are also available to train the students to take up proficiency exams like TOEFL, IEL TS, GRE and BEC.

Yoga Club

Yoga is a way of life. It is to unite body and mind, mind and soul, individual and the society. Every morning from 6.00 am to 7.00 am and evening from 5.00 pm to 6.00 pm, Yoga classes are conducted for students and staff.

Banking Facilities

Indian Bank Branch is available in the premises, for the benefit of the staff and students of the Institute. ATM Facility of Union Bank of India is also available in the Premises.

Medical Facilities

A well equipped Medical Center is available at the campus. In case of an emergency, ambulance is readily available for 24 hours a day to take the students to the hospitals located at Mayiladuthurai.

Transport Facility

The Institution has 30 buses for the benefit of the day scholar students and the staff which ply between Chidambaram, Kumbakonam, Tiruvarur, Aduthurai, Peralam, Mayiladuthurai, Poombuhar, Thiruppanandal, Eravanchery and Thiruchitrambalam to the Institution on all working days. The bus facilities are being utilized for local visits and educational trips.

Residential Facilities

Well furnished hostels for Boys and Girls with Adequate rooms are available. The living rooms are built with aesthetic layout, containing wardrobe and storage space. Telephone link is available throughout day and night. Two Student Centered dining halls with a seating capacity of 200 students are available. Well planned, well equipped servicing counters, highly modernized kitchen, a cold storage and dish washing machine along with library and internet computing

facility form a part of residential functions.

Counseling System

Faculty is assigned for counseling a batch of 24 students, who will be available for guidance and advice. The students should meet their respective staff counselors every week and discuss their progress and problems. The members of faculty are equipped to give guidance on academic, personal, social and psychological problems, and to bring about the overall development of the students.

Fitness Management

The campus provides everything a student needs for leisure management and entertainment. The Institution caters to a wide range of sports including Badminton, Basket Ball, Cricket, Hockey and Foot Ball. Indoor facilities are provided in the Student Center in addition to Shuttle Badminton courts in the quadrangle of the students' hostels. One Clay Tennis Courts and Basket Ball Court are also available.

Co-curricular and Extracurricular Activities

In addition to academic activities, the Institute is humming with co-curricular and extracurricular activities to bring out the latent talent of the students. The co-curricular activities include Technical Associations of various departments, IEEE Chapter, ISTE Chapter (Staff and Students), CSI Chapter, SAE, IIPE, ENFUSE, IETE and IEI. The extracurricular activities include NSS, Yoga Club, Blood Donation Club, Fine Arts Club, Youth Red Cross, Red Ribbon Club, IIC Cell, Women Development Cell, III Cell and IQAC Cell.

Training and Placement

In AVCCE, we emphasize on appropriate training and effective placement of our students in various industries. We prepare them to face real life situations

after graduation through regular learning and development programmes conducted for all the students. Special learning sessions are organized for the interested students to help them to develop physically, mentally, psychologically and spiritually.

The Department of Training and Placement maintains a comprehensive data base of the students ready for campus interviews and organizes placements through on campus as well as off-campus processes throughout the academic year to place all the eligible students. The department arranges industrial training in leading industries for the students during their summer and winter holidays. Blue chip companies from various sectors IT as well as Core Engineering visit the institute regularly to conduct interviews and recruit candidates. The department also conducts a series of Personality Development programmes and grooms the students from the II year of their course.
